- **1.** Council File No. 16,534 Pending Official File Ordinance No. 44-2025 An <u>ordinance</u> appropriating the sum of **\$261,142.00** from unappropriated and anticipated revenue to be received from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for the Emergency Solutions Grant **(ESG25)** projects.

1. A resolution OF THE ERIE CITY COUNCIL EXPRESSING COMMITMENT TO THE LONG-TERM VIABILITY OF THE ERIE ZOO AND SUPPORT FOR GOOD FAITH NEGOTIATIONS WITH THE ERIE COUNTY CONVENTION CENTER AUTHORITY

WHEREAS, the Erie Zoo has served as a beloved community asset for over 100 years, attracting more than 310,000 visitors annually and generating significant economic impact for the City of Erie and the broader region;

WHEREAS, the Erie Zoo generates approximately \$21.2 million in annual economic impact, supports 250 jobs, and contributes \$1.3 million in state and local tax revenue, making it a vital economic engine for our community;

WHEREAS, the Erie Zoo has faced significant challenges in recent years, including the loss of AZA (Association of Zoos and Aquariums) accreditation due to financial constraints and infrastructure deficiencies, which threatens its long-term sustainability and regional significance;

WHEREAS, the Erie County Convention Center Authority (Erie Events) has proposed a partnership to provide operational stability and financial support to the Erie Zoo, including annual operational subsidies and assistance with capital improvements necessary to regain AZA accreditation;

WHEREAS, the City Council recognizes the urgency of addressing the Zoo's operational and infrastructure needs to prevent further deterioration of this irreplaceable community asset;

WHEREAS, the City Council acknowledges its fiduciary responsibility as stewards of taxpayer-owned properties and the need for thorough due diligence in any property transfer negotiations;

WHEREAS, the preservation and enhancement of the Erie Zoo as a regional destination is consistent with the City's economic development goals and commitment to quality of life for residents;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Erie:

Section 1. Commitment to Zoo Viability The Erie City Council expresses its strong commitment to ensuring the long-term viability, sustainability, and success of the Erie Zoo as a premier regional cultural and educational asset.

Section 2. Support for Partnership Negotiations The Council commits to engaging in good faith negotiations with the Erie County Convention Center Authority regarding the proposed partnership, recognizing the potential benefits of Erie Events' operational expertise and financial capacity.

Section 3. Collaboration with Administration The Council pledges to work collaboratively with the City Administration throughout the negotiation process, providing timely consideration of proposals while maintaining appropriate legislative oversight and due diligence.

Section 4. Stewardship Responsibilities The Council reaffirms its commitment to responsible stewardship of taxpayer-owned properties and assets, ensuring that any agreements protect the public interest while advancing the Zoo's mission and community benefit.

Section 5. Public Engagement The Council supports transparent public engagement throughout the process, including opportunities for community input on proposals that may affect public recreational facilities and amenities.

Section 6. Urgency Recognition The Council acknowledges the time-sensitive nature of the Zoo's challenges and commits to prioritizing this matter to prevent further deterioration of operations and facilities.

Section 7. Conditions for Support Any final agreements shall be subject to comprehensive legal and financial review, protection of public recreational access where appropriate, guarantees of continued Zoo operations and AZA reaccreditation efforts, appropriate public benefit provisions, and approval by the Mayor and a majority of Council.

Section 8. Regional Asset Preservation The Council recognizes the Erie Zoo's importance as a regional attraction that enhances Erie's reputation, supports tourism, and contributes to economic development throughout Northwestern Pennsylvania.

Section 9. Effective Date This resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.
